MINISTER'S LETTER

Not mentioned in the January - May Newsletter was my taking the funeral service for **Peter Higgins** on 30th November 2023 at Honor Oak Crematorium. Peter was a lighthearted, much respected and loved roofer who lived in the Oval. He died suddenly, aged only 62. Our condolences, again, to his wife Elaine, family and loved ones. The last four months were pleasantly eventful. January saw: our Hello 2024 Service, introducing us to tuneful new hymns for New Years, new months, and new starts (to be added to our hymnbook by Jason shortly), very ably assisted by Soprano Ellie Neate, and followed by an excellent hotdog brunch; and via the Concert Series, Yoon Seok Shin on the piano. February saw: the beginning of Lent and the introduction of our wellreceived Lent Read, Finding Sanctuary by Abbot Christopher Jamison; and the Nazca Duo (guitar and harp). March saw: our inclusive Mothering Sunday (honouring all our significant womenfolk); our 185th Anniversary Service and AGM; Palm Sunday; Easter Sunday with Soprano Ellie Blewitt, followed by toasted hot cross buns; and Bastion Brass. April saw: an early St George's Day Service, with readings from John Cooper Clarke (who, incidentally, mentions our chapel in his recent biography) (Chickentown), Joyce Grenfell (Stately as a

Galleon), and Pam Ayres (Ask My Husband), and music including Greensleeves, The Diggers Song, Thames Flow Softly, Jerusalem, and Scarborough Fair, beautifully helped along by Soprano Lucy Peek, followed by toasted teacakes made on our super new catering size toaster. Special thanks to MD Jason and AMD Ricky, our Sopranos and other performers, and our Chairman Andrew on catering. Our very best wishes to: Toby (PGCE, UCL) and Ricky (BA Music, KCL), who are completing their studies, and going into teaching and starting a PGCE (UCL) respectively; Jason, who is now an Assistant Head of Music at a very good school, and examiner with Cambridge, while still a young 'un; lain, who remains a Visiting Fellow in Security Issues at Cambridge for an extended period, and who has recently completed the Foundation Stage, Worship Leader's Course, Unitarian College, with top marks. We are very grateful to lain for leading worship superbly in my absence in January (when I was leading Morley Ramblers on our Nightingale Centre's Winter Walking Weekend 2 in the Peak District) and February, when I was attending the first of several 60th birthday celebrations in my 60th year, both of which were great fun. I took Robert Levett's funeral service at North East Surrey Crematorium, Morden on 12th March. Robert had been a successful painter and decorator, who lived a long (88) and happy (but for his late wife and later companion predeceasing him) life. Our condolences, again, to his son Lee and family. We've had a fair share of ill-health, with two members having particular problems; and three of our members' adult children have faced health and other challenges. I'm pleased to report that, health wise at least, all are now doing well. We were very sorry to learn of Rev Jim Corrigall's retirement as District Minister. We have very much enjoyed Jim's support and friendship, and we wish him a long, healthy and happy retirement. I mentioned my 60th earlier; It feels like guite a milestone. It's not been a bad run so far: a lovely family; a happy childhood and adolescence; a good education, with particular thanks to Rev Dr Tony Cross, Manchester College, Oxford, and the Unitarians; great early romances; the friends I've made and kept since childhood; qualifying and practising at the Bar (a big deal for a kid from my background); health, some wealth, and lots of happiness; and the great loves of my life: Andrew (35 years); Brixton Unitarians (32 years); and London. I began my 60th year in the bosom of the Unitarian family at Great Hucklow in beautiful weather, making my way to the top of Mam Tor one day, and on another walking the road from Great Hucklow to Hathersage via Abney (which I'd cycled as a boy) with friends, concluding with a fantastic lunch at *The Plough*, before heading home.
